- 1. Recovery and the Importance of Language and Culture (Willis Janvier)
 - a. Dene language keeper and podcaster spoke about his journey through addiction to recovery, and how being a language keeper has provided meaning to his life.
- 2. HeART-Centered Practice: A Catalyst for Systems Change (Alex Powalinsky)
 - a. Prince Albert based art collective focusing on 2SLGBTQIA+ activism through the creation of the "Prism Project", which offers a safe-space to challenge colonialism, reclaim space in society, and celebrate indigenous identity.
- 3. Indigenous Art Practice: Guided by Relations (Stacy Fayant)
 - a. The history, art, and meaning behind indigenous tattooing.
- 4. Poster Contest (Kent Peterson)
 - a. CUPE Saskatchewan is holding a poster contest for the following environmental days: Earth Day, Clean Air Day, Water Day. Submission deadline November 21/2025.
- 5. Errrrr: Engaging in Responsible and Relational Systems (Janelle Pewapsconias)
 - a. Evolution of research surrounding Indigenous people and communities by focusing on the "5 Rs": respect, relevancy, reciprocity, responsibility, relationships. Following the 5 Rs leads to a safe and respectful way to collaborate within Indigenous communities.
- 6. Returning Warrior Medals (John Brady McDonald)
 - a. Discussion of historic oppression faced by Indigenous veterans in Canada, and the quest to return medals lost by these veterans to their families.
- 7. Implementing the Anti-Racism Strategy in Our Locals
 - a. Overviews of CUPE's Anti-Racism Strategy, and the implementation of the priority goals thus far.
 - i. 2022-23: Representation, Education, Bargaining, Data Collection
 - ii. 2023-24: Lived Experience, Governance, Organizing

- 2024-25: Enforce the Collective Agreement, Political Action, Coalition
 Work
- iv. 2025-26: Finish implementing the priority goals
- v. 2027: Review of the strategy and vote for renewal at Nation Convention
- 8. Environmental Racism (Tony Head)
 - Discussion of Bill C-5 and how Indigenous communities are being abused via exploitation of resources and improper waste disposal/clean up after industrial activity.
- 9. CUPE Communications Update (Theresa Walkowki)
 - a. "Your Neighborhood Your Community" campaign, 11,000 signatures received in support of Jordan's Principle backfill, coordinated bargaining session for EWSC, future campaigns for \$10/day childcare and health care workers in progress.
- 10. Political Action Update (Tria Donaldson)
 - a. Continues pressure on Sask. Party to address concerns around Indigenous issues, the drug crisis, sale of Crown Land, underfunding of education and health care. The Liberals have planned 15% budget cuts for Indigenous Service Canada, First Nation communities are still without clean drinking water 10 years after the Liberal took office.
